- O Promotes recreational reading of popular literature; books must be by a living author and published within the last 4 years
- O Students, teachers, librarians, and parents may nominate books
- The CYRM committee reads all nominated books and selects a well-balanced list for each category
- There are five categories: Picture Book, Picture Books for Older Readers, Intermediate, Middle School, and Young Adult; students must read all books in a category to be eligible to vote



- Compare life cycles of frogs and dogs as well as the pleasures of city and country life




Exclamation Mark

- An Exclamation Mark does not like being different; a unique story to celebrate individuality
- O Use to begin a punctuation lesson, having students write declaratory, interrogatory, and exclamatory sentences




Miss Brooks Loves Books and I Don't

- O Encourage students to dress as a character from a favorite book




Randy Reilly's Really Big Hit

Too Tall Houses


- Author and Illustrator:Gianna Marino

- O Have students design and build their own home— what issues must they consider?






Brothers at Bat

- C Learn about special pitches (the knuckleball!) and talents needed for baseball positions




The Camping Trip That Changed America

These Hands


- Author: Margaret H. Mason

- O Give background of civil rights movement














Tuesdays at the Castle

- Ages and locate real castles around the world




Wild Wings
